Kindergarten to Year 6

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 1 AND 4}

- Short-sleeved chambray shirt embroidered with OCS logo
- Grey gabardine flat front, elastic back shorts with OCS embroidered in grey
- Grey crew socks – at least ankle height
- Navy bucket hat with OCS logo
- Black leather lace-up school shoes
- Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Summer uniform primary girls

Kindergarten to Year 6

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 1 AND 4}

- Navy and white dress (length to knee height)
OR
- Navy tailored shorts with OCS embroidered in red and tucked-in white short-sleeved peter-pan shirt (with navy tab-tie)
- Navy crew socks (at least ankle height)
- Navy bucket hat with OCS logo
- Black leather lace-up school shoes
- Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Summer uniform secondary boys

Year 7 to Year 10

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 1 AND 4}

- White short-sleeved shirt embroidered with OCS logo
- Dark grey tailored, pleated shorts with OCS embroidered in grey
- Grey crew socks – at least ankle height
- Navy cap with OCS logo on back or navy bucket hat embroidered with OCS logo
- Plain navy tie
- Black leather lace-up school shoes
- Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Summer uniform secondary girls

Year 7 to Year 10

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 1 AND 4}

- White (short-sleeve) shirt with OCS Logo,
- tartan skirt (knee length) or tartan shorts (knee length)
- Navy knee length socks
- Navy cap with OCS logo on back or navy bucket hat embroidered with OCS logo
- Black leather lace-up school shoes
- Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Winter uniform primary boys

Kindergarten to Year 6

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 2 AND 3}

- Long-sleeved chambray shirt embroidered with OCS logo
- Grey gabardine flat front, elastic back long trousers with OCS embroidered in grey
- Grey crew socks – at least ankle height
- Navy bucket hat with OCS logo or navy beanie with OCS logo
- Black leather lace-up school shoes
- Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Winter uniform primary girls

Kindergarten to Year 6

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 2 AND 3}

- Red and navy tartan pinafore (modest knee length)
- OR
- Navy tailored long pants embroidered with OCS in red
 - White short or long-sleeved peter-pan shirt (with navy tab-tie)
 - Navy knee high socks or navy tights
 - Navy bucket hat with OCS logo or navy beanie embroidered with OCS
 - Black leather lace-up school shoes
 - Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
 - Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Winter uniform secondary boys

Year 7 to Year 10

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 2 AND 3}

- White long-sleeved shirt embroidered with OCS logo
- Dark grey tailored, pleated long trousers with OCS embroidered in grey
- Short or long grey socks
- Navy cap with OCS on back or navy beanie with OCS logo
- Navy tie
- Black leather lace-up school shoes
- Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Winter uniform secondary girls

Year 7 to Year 10

{TO BE WORN IN TERMS 2 AND 3}

- Navy and red tartan pleated skirt (calf length)
- OR**
- Navy tailored pants embroidered with OCS in red
 - White short or long-sleeved shirt with navy tab-tie
 - Navy knee length socks or navy tights
 - Navy cap with OCS on back or navy beanie with OCS
 - Black leather lace-up school shoes
 - Red jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
 - Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Senior secondary boys

Year 11 and Year 12

{TO BE WORN ALL YEAR ROUND BY YEAR 11 & 12 BOYS}

- White short-sleeved shirt embroidered with OCS logo (optional long-sleeve for winter)
- Navy tie with fine red stripes
- Dark grey tailored pleated long trousers with OCS embroidered in grey
- Short or long grey socks
- Navy cap embroidered with OCS at the back
- Black leather lace up school shoes
- Navy jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy blazer over navy jumper (compulsory for Terms 2 and 3) or in cold weather can be substituted by School anorak. (The school blazer is to be worn on formal occasions. Eg. Special assemblies and excursions).

Senior secondary girls

Year 11 and Year 12

{TO BE WORN ALL YEAR ROUND BY YEAR 11 & 12 GIRLS}

- Navy and red tartan pleated skirt (calf length) **OR**
- Navy tailored pants embroidered with OCS in red
- White short or long-sleeved shirt with tartan tab-tie
- Navy knee length socks or navy tights
- Navy cap with OCS logo on back or navy beanie with OCS logo
- Black leather lace up school shoes
- Navy jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy blazer (compulsory for Terms 2 and 3) or in cold weather can be substituted by School anorak. (The school blazer is to be worn on formal occasions. Eg. Special assemblies and excursions).

Sports

{UNISEX UNIFORM TO BE WORN ON ALL SPORTS DAYS AS NOTIFIED BY THE SCHOOL}

- Polar fleece jumper with Orange Christian School embroidered to be worn on sports days only (optional)
- Navy shorts with red piping on the side
- OR
- Navy track pants with red piping
- Red and navy polo shirt with OCS embroidered logo
- Navy bucket hat with OCS logo (Prep to Yr 6), navy cap embroidered with OCS at the back (Yr 7 to Yr 12) Note, bucket hat may be worn in secondary if desired.
- Plain white ankle length sports socks
- Sports sneakers – any colour
- Navy zip jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

Prep

{UNISEX UNIFORM TO BE WORN ALL YEAR ROUND ON DAYS ATTENDING PREP}

- Navy shorts with red piping **OR**
- Navy track pants with red piping
- Red and navy polo shirt with OCS embroidered logo
- Polar fleece jumper embroidered with Orange Christian School
- Navy bucket hat with OCS logo
- Plain white sports socks
- Sports sneakers – any colour
- Navy jacket embroidered with OCS logo (optional)

General uniform guidelines

All uniform items should be clean, ironed and clearly labelled with the student's name. Printed labels are highly recommended.

Students are expected to wear their school uniform before and after school such as travelling to and from school, shopping centres, or on excursions etc.

Hair

Must be neat and tidy of a natural colour and unlikely to cause comment eg. Pink hair, mullets etc. Long hair should be tied back during specific lessons (Practical Subjects and Sports). Accessories: Plain navy blue or uniform material headbands or hair elastics may be worn to secure hair away from face. Boys should be cleanly shaven.

Jewellery

Students may wear a watch (please note that smart watches that connect to the internet/wifi/mobile data can't be worn at school), a simple banded or signet ring, not more than two studs (size no larger than 5mm) or sleepers in each ear. No other visible jewellery and piercings are allowed eg. Bracelets, necklaces. (Medical bracelets/necklaces/earrings are acceptable).

Body Piercing & Body Art

This activity is not encouraged by the school. Body ornaments must not be worn while in school uniform or attending a school related event. Students are not permitted to have tattoos at school.

Makeup & Nail Polish

Students are discouraged from wearing makeup. Foundation of natural colour is permitted and/or clear lip balm. Nails should be trimmed for safety reasons and nail polish must be clear or natural coloured. False nails/lashes are not permitted.

Hats

The wearing of hats when outside is an important precaution against sun burn. School hats are to be worn for outside activities all year round for all students. Students can wear Navy Bucket hat with OCS logo OR Navy OCS cap (from Year 7 – Year 12). Hats are not to be worn inside classrooms or buildings.

Additional Clothing

Students may choose to wear additional layers of clothing under their school uniform such as thermal underwear. These however, must not be visible. In particular, t-shirt neckbands and sleeves must not be visible or protrude under the school uniform. Dark coloured and/or patterned t-shirts showing through the school uniform are not acceptable.

Skirt & Dress Lengths

All dresses are to be worn no shorter than the top of the knee. The Year 7 – 12 girls summer tartan skirt/shorts is to be worn no shorter than the top of the knee.

Winter secondary skirts are to be worn at calf length. Ankle length skirts are not acceptable. Waistbands on slacks, trousers and skirts are not to be worn lower than the hips.

Shirts

Must be tucked in. Sports shirts are the exception.

The Year 7 – 12 girls Summer white shirt to be worn over the top of the summer tartan skirt or shorts, unless a jumper is worn with it and then it must be tucked in.

Sports Shoes

Sport shoes (sneakers) should be designed for gym/outdoor activities and should be durable, flexible, and support the arches.

School Dress Shoes

Black leather lace-up school shoes are to be worn. Ankle height, no boots allowed. However, Primary students are permitted to wear

Velcro fastened or buckled black leather shoes. Black sneakers are not acceptable.

Identification and Ownership

All uniform items should be clearly and appropriately labelled with the current owner's name. Printed labels are highly recommended.

Anoraks

The OCS anorak jacket is an optional addition to the uniform for students in Years 7 to 12. The anorak is to be worn over the school jumper.

Variations to uniform.

At OCS, we understand that the uniform may not be correctly attired all the time. If there is a variation for the day, please match the uniform as best you can and send a written note with the student. An exemption Uniform Note will be granted to the student by the relevant Head of School and this will exempt the student for a certain amount of days. Anything longer will require the Deputy Principal's approval.

Uniform Code of Conduct

By attending OCS, students agree to abide by the School's Code of Conduct which specifies in regard to school uniform that students will maintain a neat appearance, wear full school uniform, including sports uniform when required. Any variation to the uniform may result in a caution, confiscation, and/or lunch time detention.

Examples:

Caution: A reminder to wear the uniform correctly. This is also a warning in that it may result in a confiscation or detention. For example, a student wears a hat in class and is asked to take it off. Student has an untucked shirt and is reminded to tuck it in. Student wears the incorrect socks to Sport. Student wears make-up beyond what is prescribed.

Confiscation: Student wears an inappropriate jumper that contains offensive language. Student wears piercings outside the ear. Student repeatedly wears the incorrect beanie. A student repeatedly wears incorrect jewellery. (All confiscated items will be returned at the end of the day)

Detention This applies to issues similar to those for confiscation, or where a student repeatedly ignores cautions; wears something inappropriate; refuses to comply with the Uniform Code of Conduct.

Variation to uniform

Example of a variation to uniform note for a day:
